- A. Student Enrollment current verses projected
 - a. Currently there are 92 students enrolled
 - i. When a school drops under 100 students they lose the multiplier in the foundation formula which equates to somewhere between 50-70 thousand for our district

Project Grad is in the 3rd year of an Alaska Native Ed Grant

Project Grad has applied for a GEAR grant which would be a 6 year grant focusing & following student from 2-7 grade

Project Grad offers graduating students 4k over a 4 year period for post grad studies. This grant is unique to Project Grad Schools

Project Grad did a Professional Development class in August for teachers which was very well attended and received.

Project Grad is in the process of finalizing institutes for students to attend during the school year

Project Grad offers up to 2 credits for the Kenai Peninsula Native Leadership Program (you do not have to be Native to receive credits.

Project Grad employees 4 educational coaches, 2 family support personal, 1 elementary reading support staff as well as Jane Beck the coordinator and 1 office personal

Blended Learning; Professional Learning Communities; Video Conferencing; Digital Content & Resources; Targeted Instruction; Centers/Stations/Small group work; Flipped Classrooms; Student Ownership; Project Based Learning; Data Driven Decisions; Differentiated Instruction. This just ties it all together
 - 2. Self reflection students access need and progress thru self reflection
 - 3. Ownership in the direction a students goals are achieved
 - iii. The 4 R's Ready for, Rigor, Relevance & Responsive
